and utilizing literacy services as a learner. Negar recognized the efforts of NMPL and all the volunteers and learners in the program

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
In Our own Words: Empowering Learners through Literacy


Learning to read and write is a basic skill that unfortunately not everybody masters. In order to teach learners with low literacy skills, we must first understand the difficulties and obstacles they may encounter.

Mastering writing requires developing its highly interrelated component skills: vocabulary, comprehension and fluency. These components are crucial for a learner's literacy development. Writing is proved effective when a learner understands how to integrate all of these elements into writing.

Newport/Mesa ProLiteracy offers a chance for learners to showcase their literacy growth and abilities through their own words in a journal entitled just that: "In Our Own Words"

Learners at every level are encouraged to submit their essays, stories, poems and other writings, of no more than 500 words, to the Literacy Office by July 28th.

Playaway Bookpacks

Playaway Audiobook Bookpacks are kits with books preloaded on MP3 devices and paired with a printed copy. This is a relatively new collection and we have many titles available to borrow from the Literacy office.

Bookpacks are an easy way for emerging and struggling readers to improve reading comprehension and retention, vocabulary skills, build phonemic awareness and fluency, and more.

The all-in-one audiobook is:

- **Simple:** 5 narration speeds so you can listen at your own pace; automatic bookmarking remembers when you took a break.
- **Portable:** Weighs only 2 ounces; equipped with a universal jack—listen in the car or with any type of headphone.



• **Durable:** No screen to scratch and protected by special portfolio carrier that holds both book and MP3 player.

Bookpacks are available to our tutors and learners and must be signed out directly from the Literacy office.
