LEARNER'S CORNER

Irvine Museum Highlights by Negar Pourasad

Thank you so much for providing us all amazing events and programs such as the Irvine museum field trip. Carolyn, our tour guide, gave us a great tour and tried to simplify general information about different art eras and addressed their distinctive characteristics of each style in the exhibition's paintings. It's always hard to pick one out of several interesting ones. The first painting that caught my eyes turned out to be my favorite. Although it wasn't a big frame, the interesting oil on canvas painting by William Clapp called Country Road made me frozen for a moment. It was like watching a garden in spring full of blossom through a rainy window glass. I saw myself sitting in a warm chair and the spring rain had made the scene blurry. The blended colors of the garden's creatures by using the pointillism technique was so powerful that I could even hear the rain pitter-pattered on the window glass. I found the museum's flyers and postcards with the same artwork as a representative of this collection by the entrance door when we were leaving the museum, as if the postcard designers heard the rain melody the way I did and that's why they chose it too.

Eve-Marie began her career at a financial consulting firm as a marketing professional. In 2002, she co-founded a new consulting firm focused on non-profit organizations. A passion for the non-profit sector sparked her interest in joining the board of Newport Mesa ProLiteracy. After serving two back-to-back terms, and taking a mandatory year away, Eve-Marie came back to the board - now serving as its President. During the course of this service, Eve-Marie changed her career path entirely. Today, she is responsible for a \$12 million dollar major gifts campaign at Mercy For Animals, a global non-profit dedicated to advocating against animal abuse in industrialized agriculture. Eve-Marie holds an MBA in Marketing from Arizona State University, and has also completed her Certified Fund Raising Certification (CFRE). Eve-Marie is honored by the ability to lend her skills and passion to Newport Mesa ProLiteracy, and looks forward to elevating the organization's fundraising efforts in particular.

Why you chose or how you got involved with NBPL?

In 2006, my then 78-year-old father-in-law avoided the doctor at all costs. It was not until he was forced, by way of a 911 call and an ambulance ride, to see a doctor about a lingering breathing problem. He was diagnosed with Stage 4 lung cancer, and in less than two weeks, he lost his battle with cancer and passed away. What I learned, after he passed, was that the reason he avoided the doctor was not due to his disdain for the medical field, instead, it was because he was unable to read. The stigma of shame he would have faced, had the truth been revealed, was strong enough to drive decisions that ultimately cost him his life.



This experience honed my perception on the value of reading and writing, and gave me a lens to look at others and imagine what a struggle life could be without these abilities. When I found Newport Mesa ProLiteracy, the organization's purpose directly aligned with my passionate belief. I have dedicated my time in service to this organization's mission, in the hopes that others can be prevented from suffering in shame and silence like my father-in-law once did.
