LEARNER HIGHLIGHT: Tugba Taskin

<u>Could you tell us a bit about your journey</u> <u>learning English? When did you start, and what</u> <u>motivated you?</u>

After I came to the US, the cashier asked me a question on my first shopping trip. I didn't understand. When the cashier realized I didn't understand, she asked me again. I still didn't understand. Then she showed me a bag and asked me if I wanted it. That's when I realized how bad my English was. Even though my communication skills were very good and I loved communicating, I couldn't express myself. I started ESL class as soon as I could, but Covid-19 came out within two months. While taking care of my children at home, I was constantly watching grammar lesson videos on YouTube. When I had difficulty understanding, I sometimes got stressed, but my desire to learn never stopped. My oldest son had just started kindergarten and was learning very guickly. When he started first grade, I could barely understand him. It made me feel like I was missing out on their lives. Learning a new language definitely boosts your self-confidence. It also develops your sense of belonging. I always told myself this. Never give up!

LEARNER HIGHLIGHT: Tugba Taskin

What were some of the biggest challenges you faced when you were first learning English, especially with reading and writing?

I remembered my first year of elementary school. I was very excited. I felt the same childish excitement. The most difficult thing for me while reading a book was pronunciation. How do you pronounce this word? How should I make the sounds? I still have difficulty. I realized that we don't move our jaw muscles much when we speak Turkish, but when we speak English, my jaw muscles need to be more flexible.

I can say that writing is the most enjoyable and relaxing thing in life for me. I am someone who writes very emotional poems and articles in my native language. I was very curious about whether one day I would be able to put my feelings and thoughts into writing in English with the same feeling and meaning. Is this possible in all languages? Do you know when I started to love English after all these years? There is a saying that I love very much in Turkish. I was very happy when I learned that this saying also exists in English. 'Every cloud has a silver lining.' All languages are created for humans. Enjoying the process is a very important factor in learning.

<u>Congratulations on writing a book! Can you tell us about the book? What is it</u> <u>about, and what inspired you to write it?</u>

Thank you very much. Our book includes our caravan camps and our travels with the RV, which we did as a family to collect memories. I wrote this book from my oldest son's perspective. I wanted it to be a beautiful memory that we could leave to our children. It was an unforgettable memory for us. We hoped it would inspire other families.

How has writing this book impacted your confidence, particularly in your English language abilities?

A person's lifestyle definitely affects their vocabulary. Even our children learned a lot of words they didn't know before. For example, 'Awning, Rv slide, leveler, fresh tank etc... Writing is like a legacy left to the future. When I was a child, I published a book of poetry. We printed exactly 300 copies. I promoted each one and sold them myself. My self-confidence increased a lot then. I felt the same confidence inside me. This book gave me the freedom and self-confidence that every person can express themselves in every language.

<u>What advice would you give to other adult English language learners who</u> <u>dream of writing a book?</u>

They can start writing in the same simplicity as a elementary school student. As we learn and use words, they fit into our brains like puzzle pieces. But when we don't use them, they just fly away. Believe in the power of words. It is very important and meaningful for a person to be able to express themselves. Sometimes a pen and a blank page can be your best friend.

In his videos, Oliver often introduces himself by saying "I'm a 36-year-old man who struggles with reading." However, it wasn't long ago that he would say "I can't read." You see until Oliver was in his 30s, he was functionally illiterate.

His story has been so inspiring that he ended up being interviewed on ABS's Good Morning America, the Jennifer Hudson Show, NPR and other major outlets. He was featured in People magazine and in December, Oliver joined Tamron Hall on her show to discuss his reading journey. Oliver was also awarded the 2023 National Literacy Honors Award by the Barbara Bush Foundation for the light he shed on being functionally illiterate. Now, Oliver speaks to schools, conferences and educators about many topics. He talks about the importance of literacy as well as opening up about many deep struggles he has gone thorugh with learnring to read as an adult, his challenges, triumphs and his mental health.
