

RECAP: New Learner Orientation


This month we had seven learners complete our Summer New Learner


Join us for an International Brunch and celebrate our Literacy community!

This means we will NOT be holding classes and no tutoring sessions will be able to take place at the library. The Literacy Lab will also be closed during this time.




