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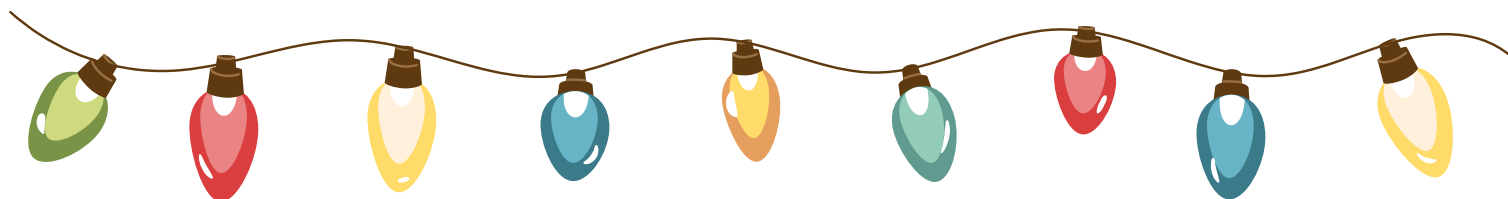

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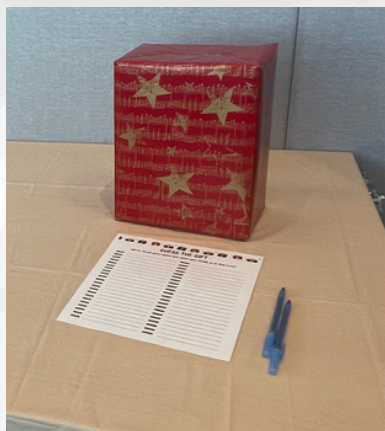
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LEARNER HIGHLIGHT: Meet Candace Kirby

Could you tell us a bit about your journey learning English?
When did you start, and what motivated you?

Life took a challenging turn for me at the age of nine when I lost my mother to breast cancer. Growing up without her guidance was difficult, and I faced many ups and downs that made my early education a struggle. Reading, writing, and comprehension were particularly hard, leaving me feeling lost in a world that often felt overwhelming.

However, rather than letting my past define my future, I sought a path toward improvement. In May 2018, I found a lifeline through Project Adult Literacy at the Newport Beach Public Library. My motivation to learn English was driven by my determination to support my children academically and socially. I wanted to be present in their lives, not just as a parent but as an active participant in their experiences.

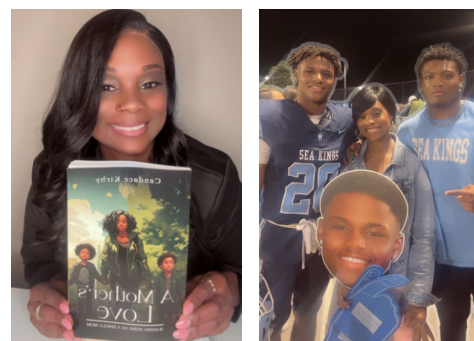
In April 2019, I was honored to be invited as the guest speaker at the Gift of Literacy Luncheon at the Pacific Club in Newport Beach. Sharing my story with others was a profound experience, and I was deeply moved by how many attendees were touched by my journey and inspired by my courage.

Initially, I battled social anxiety, which made it difficult to engage in social situations. I often preferred to observe rather than participate.

But through the supportive environment of the literacy program, I began to build confidence. Now, I can articulate my thoughts clearly and feel included in our vibrant sports community. I still respect my boundaries, but I no longer shy away from engaging with others.

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LEARNER HIGHLIGHT: Meet Candace Kirby

What were some of the biggest challenges you faced when you were first learning English, especially with reading and writing?

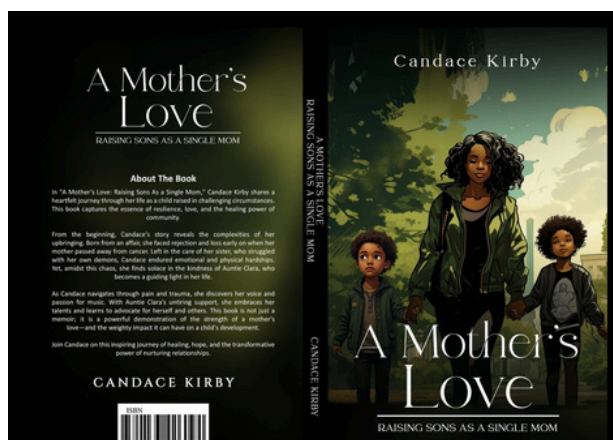
I often felt embarrassed to read out loud or even to ask questions during my tutoring sessions. I worried about sounding stupid, even though I was there to learn and receive help. However, I didn't let that fear stop me; I put my pride aside and focused on the belief that I would improve.

Writing was another significant challenge. At the age of 32, I struggled to construct proper, complete sentences. Revisiting the basics of English not only reminded me of what I had learned before but also introduced me to new information that strengthened my foundation over time.

Congratulations on writing a book! Can you tell us about the book? What is it about, and what inspired you to write it?

My book is titled "A Mother's Love: Raising Sons as a Single Mom." It tells the story of my journey as a single mother, navigating the unique challenges and joys of raising my sons. I wanted to share my experiences and the lessons I've learned along the way, hoping to resonate with other mothers who may be facing similar situations.

The inspiration behind writing this book stems from my desire to empower single moms and provide them with a sense of community. I believe that our stories can inspire others to find strength and resilience in their own lives. Writing this book was a cathartic process for me, allowing me to reflect on my journey and celebrate the love I have for my children.

How has writing this book impacted your confidence, particularly in your English language abilities?

Writing this book has significantly boosted my confidence in my English skills. It showed me that I could express my thoughts and feelings in writing, which was once a daunting task. However, I want to acknowledge that just because I wrote a book doesn't mean I'm perfect. I still have moments where I say the wrong thing or feel the urge to run away from social interactions.

Each day, I strive to be better than I was yesterday, embracing the growth that comes from both my successes and my challenges. The journey of learning and improving is ongoing, and I'm committed to continuing that path.



What advice would you give to other adult English language learners who dream of writing a book?

My advice to fellow adult English learners who aspire to write a book is simple: start writing, no matter how imperfect it feels. Don't let your fear of making mistakes hold you back. Writing is a process, and it's okay to start with rough drafts. Focus on expressing your ideas and experiences; the more you write, the more your skills will improve.

Also, seek support from others—whether through writing groups, mentors, or literacy programs. Sharing your work with others can provide valuable feedback and encouragement. Remember, every writer has faced challenges, but perseverance is key. Believe in your voice and your story; it matters.

Thanks to this program, I've transformed my challenges into strengths, proving that it's never too late to learn and grow.
